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2010 WALL STREET INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Overview:	The AlumniAthlete Network Wall Street Internship Program is a 10-week summer internship program targeted to collegiate sophomores and juniors who have shown a commitment to intercollegiate athletics and academic excellence. The program began in the summer of 2004. Since that time, we have placed more than 200 student-athletes at major Wall Street firms including Bank of America, Citi, Credit Suisse, Deutsche Bank, Goldman Sachs, JP Morgan, Lehman Brothers, Merrill Lynch and UBS. Our participants have served in many different areas of our partner firms including investment banking, sales & trading, capital markets, research, asset management, private wealth management and operations.

Marketing:	The program is marketed to over 400 major colleges and universities. We receive over 1,000 applications annually. Applicants submit the following materials in their application: cover letter, resume, writing sample, recorded interview question responses and transcript	
Interviewing:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The AlumniAthlete Network selects the interview pool and organizes all interview logistics ○ Approximately 100 candidates are interviewed ○ Interview take place in New York City ○ Each candidate has three (3) half-hour interviews, each with a different Corporate Partner 	
Candidate Selection/ Placement Process	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ We expect to place 25-35 interns this year ○ Median scores for placements (6-year average): GPA – 3.67; SAT - 1390 ○ The program had a 90% offer rate (6-year average) ○ Candidates are placed at firms based upon firm preference; participating firms 	

	<p>typically receive 2 of their top 4 candidates by department (e.g. investment banking, sales & trading, etc.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ We have placed candidates in New York City, Boston, Charlotte, Chicago, Stamford and San Francisco ○ Interns have represented more than 70 different universities including: Amherst, Bates, Brown, Columbia, Dartmouth, Duke, Emory, Evansville, Fordham, George Washington, Georgetown, Hampden-Sydney, Howard, Indiana University, Ithaca College, Johns Hopkins, Manhattan, MIT, New Jersey Institute of Technology, North Carolina State, Notre Dame, Northwestern, NYU, Ohio State, Pomona College, Princeton, Smith, SMU, Spellman, Tufts, UNC Charlotte, UPenn, USC, Vassar, Vanderbilt, Washington (STL), Wesleyan, Wisconsin, and Yale ○ The program has historically provided tremendous diversity: 53% Non-Core Schools; 55% Female; 21% Minority (historically disadvantaged) ○ All interns get individual mentoring and training through the program
<p>Commitments of Corporate Partners:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Provide internships in investment banking, research, capital markets or sales & trading ○ Compensate intern for a 10-week period at a level which is commensurate with compensation for other like internship programs at Corporate Partner ○ Organize and execute at least one event, reception or presentation for all participants in the Internship Program at Corporate Partner's expense ○ Designate a point person that will serve as a direct point of contact for AlumniAthlete Network ○ Make a minimum of one individual available to interview on each interview day ○ Provide mentors for interns that are not within the intern's day-to-day work group
